WORKERS DEMANDS

- 1. Harmonisation of the labour laws in Zimbabwe
- **2.** Alignment of the Health Services Act to the Constitution and the International Standards ratified by Zimbabwe.
- 3. We demand Protection from forced Labour.
- 4. Protection of Health Services Workers from violence and harassment and ratification of ILO Convention 190.
- 5. Full enjoyment of
- **6.** Recognition of the absolute right to Collective Bargaining for workers in the Health Services Sector (Ref: Zimbabwe Constitution & ILO Convention 98).
- **7.** Parties to a dispute should be given every opportunity to bargain collectively, for a sufficient period of time, with the help of independent facilitators.
- **8.** Demand **Full enjoyment of the Right to Freedom of Association** for workers in the Health Services Sector (Ref: Zimbabwe Constitution & ILO C087).
- **9. Removal of criminal sanctions on the right to strike** for Health Services Workers and the full recognition of the right.
- 10. Responsibility of declaring a strike in the Heath Sector illegal to be fully vested in the Judicial Authorities.
- 11. Any restrictions placed on the right to strike in terms of the Essential Services Rule, be accompanied by adequate, impartial and speedy conciliation and arbitration proceedings in which the parties concerned can take part at every stage and in which the awards, once made, are fully and promptly implemented.
- **12.** We demand **compliance with the terms of awards** handed down by the compulsory arbitration tribunal.
- **13. Removal of penal or punitive sanctions and arrests** of workers who participate in a peaceful, legitimate strike or picketing.
- 14. No to victimisation of trade union leaders in the Health Sector.

15. Adherence and Enforcement of the TNF Act No. 3 of 2019 in particular section 3 (2)
(f) which provides among other functions of the TNF, to "Consult and Negotiate Zimbabwe labour laws in line with the Constitution and other international best practices".
